USET Resolution No. 2004:036

## SUPPORT FOR TRIBAL SELF-DETERMINATION IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF INCOME ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS FOR HOUSING APPLICANTS

- WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and
- WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA) established income eligibility standards and requirements; and
- WHEREAS, these requirements were determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), thereby infringing on an Indian Tribes' ability to determine their own requirements based on need; and
- WHEREAS, the United States has certain trust responsibilities to all American Indians and Alaskan Natives regardless of their income and related social circumstances; and
- WHEREAS, American Indian Tribes and their governments are in the most responsible and qualified positions for determining the needs of their tribal members with regard to income eligibility standards; therefore, be it
- **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors does hereby support a proposed NAHASDA Amendment to allow tribes to determine income eligibility standards for their tribal members for participation in their housing programs.
