USET Resolution No. 2004:066

ABUSIVE TAX SCHEMES IN INDIAN COUNTRY

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of twenty-four (24) federally recognized tribes; and WHEREAS. the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member tribes' leadership; and WHEREAS. the Internal Revenue Service Office of Indian Tribal Governments (ITG) has formed a new task force to combat abusive and fraudulent tax schemes in Indian Country; and WHEREAS, some Indian nations have been victims of such abusive transactions, exposing said nations to potential legal liability and other adverse consequences; and WHEREAS, the use of tribal sovereignty to facilitate the nonpayment of income taxes by non-Indians is inappropriate and may threaten the sovereign and independent status of all Indian nations; and WHEREAS. ITG has requested the assistance of USET and its member tribes in combating the promotion of abusive and fraudulent tax schemes in Indian Country; therefore, be it **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors strongly supports the efforts of ITG to protect Indian nations from unscrupulous promoters of unlawful tax shelters and similar transactions; and, be it further **RESOLVED** that the USET Board of Directors shall assist the ITG task force in its efforts to identify and expose abusive tax schemes and to educate its member tribes regarding such
