USET Resolution No. 2008:043

OPPOSITION TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY DECISION TO DENY CAYUGA NATION REQUEST

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization

comprised of twenty-five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each

member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes'

leadership; and

WHEREAS, the Cayuga Nation of New York is a member in good standing of USET; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated April 28, 2008 the USET President was informed of a dispute between the

Cayuga Nation and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding the request of Cayuga Nation to withdraw from the Haudenosaunee Environmental Task Force (HETF) and to pursue EPA General Assistance Program (GAP) funding on a direct

basis for the benefit of the Cayuga Nation; and

WHEREAS, the EPA has refused to acknowledge and act in accordance with the authority of Mr. Clint

Halftown, the Bureau of Indian Affairs recognized representative of the Cayuga Nation and

has denied the Nation's request for direct GAP funding; therefore, be it

RESOLVED the USET Board of Directors opposes the decision of the U.S. Environmental Protection

Agency to refuse acknowledgement and to act upon resolutions of the Cayuga Nation

Council as communicated by the Nation's representative Clint Halftown.
