USET Resolution No. 2009:005

SUPPORT OF PENOBSCOT NATION BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB

United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization WHEREAS,

comprised of twenty-five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each WHEREAS,

member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes'

leadership; and

the Penobscot Nation Boys and Girls Club (PNBGC) has been serving 200 youth between WHEREAS,

the ages of 5-18 since 2000; and

the PNBGC has been in the forefront of youth development working with young people WHEREAS.

from disadvantaged economic, social and family circumstances; and

the PNBGC offers year round after-school and vacation activity programs designed with a WHEREAS,

culturally specific adaptation of the social development model, directly addressing critical community risk factors for delinquency by providing Tribal youth with opportunities to develop skills needed for successful involvement in age-specific activities and social interaction with other youth, Tribal elders and positive role models throughout the

community; and

PNBGC programs are designed to reduce the potentially adverse impact American WHEREAS,

Indian/Alaska Native youth face growing up and going to some schools in a non-Indian

culture by strengthening their cultural identity; and

PNBGC programs explicitly promote positive youth development among the critical areas WHEREAS.

of cultural, social, emotional, intellectual and physical dimensions simultaneously; and

a non-Tribal Boys and Girls Club entity administers the PNBGC and subsequently collects WHEREAS,

20% of pass through funding directed to the PNBGC, thus creating a disproportionate

burden on PNBGC resources; and

the non-Tribal Boys and Girls Club entity that administers the PNBGC documents the WHEREAS.

affiliation with hundreds of Tribal youth from the PNBGC and other Wabanaki Tribes, but doesn't effectively re-distribute it's allocation of millions of dollars to the PNBGC or other

Wabanaki Tribes; and

the PNBGC has established a 501(c)3 to become 100% self-sufficient and in the near WHEREAS, future be in a position to act as the entity that can more fairly and effectively administer

other Tribal Boys and Girls Clubs within the Wabanaki Alliance and the Northeast; and

the PNBGC has started a \$6 million endowment fund campaign to ensure the WHEREAS.

sustainability of its successful youth programs and form a sustainable financial model that

other American Indian/Alaska Native Clubs could benefit from; and

individual members of USET support the mission of the Penobscot Nation Boys and Girls WHEREAS,

Club with monetary contributions or other resources, in an advisory manner, or by providing any other means at their disposal that will bolster the ability of the PNBGC to

complete their \$6 million endowment campaign; and

WHEREAS,

an endowment for the Penobscot Nation Boys and Girls Club can:

- provide consistent financial support for the programs that make the Club successful
- make the programs permanent and not entirely dependent on funds acquired through traditional development and fundraising efforts
- provide income for the on-going maintenance of the Club's physical plant
- motivate generosity; and

WHEREAS,

the Penobscot Nation Boys and Girls Club PNBGC will not be able to meet their \$6 million endowment goal with only limited support within the state of Maine; therefore, be it

RESOLVED

the USET Board of Directors supports the mission of the Penobscot Nation Boys and Girls Club and pledges to advocate for the successful completion of the \$6 million endowment campaign.
