USET Resolution No. 2009:009

SUPPORT FOR INCREASED FUNDING FOR NASHVILLE AREA INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE SANITATION FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal WHEREAS, organization comprised of twenty-five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions WHEREAS, of each member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the

member Tribes' leadership; and

a U.S. Government treaty obligation exists to provide health services for 1.9 WHEREAS,

million American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN); and

the Indian Health Service (IHS), under the direction of the Department of Health WHEREAS,

and Human Services (HHS), provides for the well being of members of federally recognized Indian Tribes though the Office of Public Health to comply with the

treaty obligations; and

one of the programs administered by the IHS Office of Public Health is the WHEREAS.

Sanitation Facilities Construction Program (SFCP); and

it is known that when safe water and adequate wastewater disposal systems are WHEREAS,

available in the home, they are of fundamental importance to social and economic development, which leads to an improved quality of life and an improved sense of

well-being for Tribal members; and

HHS provides an annual budget to the IHS for the SFCP for the installation and WHEREAS,

repair of safe drinking water supplies and adequate wastewater disposal systems

for tribal members; and

these funds are divided amongst the twelve areas of the IHS; and WHEREAS,

the NAO of the IHS services the member Tribes of USET for the SFCP; and WHEREAS,

the SFCP funding for Nashville Area has remained stagnant at \$3.4 million for the WHEREAS,

last seven budget years; and

the need for IHS SFCP funds continues to escalate year after year, and the cost WHEREAS,

of construction of wells and wastewater treatment disposal systems have doubled

in the past six years; and

due to the lack of sufficient funding to the Nashville Area SFCP, many Tribes have WHEREAS,

not been awarded funding for several years leaving the Tribes unable to provide safe drinking water facilities and adequate wastewater disposal systems for their

members in both existing homes and for new construction homes; therefore, be it

the USET Board of Directors strongly urges the Chief of the Division of Sanitation RESOLVED

Facilities Construction to provide adequate funding to the Nashville Area Office to provide the desperately needed safe drinking water and adequate wastewater disposal systems for the American Indians/Alaska Natives living in the tribally

designated areas of USET Tribes; and, be it further

RESOLVED

the USET Board of Directors requests the Director of Indian Health Service, Robert G. McSwain, to increase the annual budget to \$14 million from Congress for the provision of Sanitation Facilities Construction for American Indians/Alaska Natives in the upcoming budget session and future budget sessions to comply with the U.S. Government treaty obligations to provide the needed health services.
