USET Resolution No. 2009:011

PROTECTION OF CAHOKIA MOUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

United South and Eastern Tribes Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization WHEREAS. comprised of twenty-five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS,

the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member

Tribes' leadership; and

Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site is a National Historic Landmark and a World WHEREAS,

Heritage Site; and

pursuant to USET Resolution 2007:033, USET has designated Cahokia Mounds State WHEREAS.

Historic Site as a sacred site; and

Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site is an ancient American Indian/Alaska Native WHEREAS,

sacred site and ceremonial complex, occupied from 650-1400 CE located in Illinois

across the Mississippi River from present day St. Louis; and

the modern day Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site has at least 109 American WHEREAS,

Indian/Alaska Native mounds and represents the largest known American

Indian/Alaska Native sacred site and ceremonial complex to the Mississippian culture;

and

protection of the Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site is of interest to all American WHEREAS.

Indian/Alaska Native peoples committed to an accurate understanding of the history and cultural richness of the American Indian/Alaska Natives of this land; and

it is not known where the defined perimeter limits of habitation are for Cahokia Mounds WHEREAS,

State Historic Site; and

there is proposed construction/development of a landfill that adversely impacts both WHEREAS,

physically and spiritually our American Indian/Alaska Native sacred site, Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site, and all of the surrounding sites that are present and those

waiting to be acknowledged; therefore, be it

the USET Board of Directors demands, because of the absence of consultation with RESOLVED

the USET Tribes concerning Army Corp of Engineers permitting for North Millan

Landfill, the immediate suspension of all project activities; and, be it further

the USET Board of Directors authorizes the USET President to appoint an ad hoc RESOLVED

committee to investigate effects on the Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site including,

but not limited to, the proposed landfill; and, be it further

the USET Board of Directors authorizes the USET President, in coordination with the RESOLVED ad hoc committee, to contact other Tribes associated with the Cahokia Mounds State

Historic Site to coordinate American Indian/Alaska Native efforts to protect the site and

provide for its proper interpretation.
