USET Resolution No. 2009:042

SUPPORT OF THE EXPEDITIOUS ACCEPTANCE OF THE CAYUGA NATION'S FEE-TO-TRUST APPLICATIONS

WHEREAS, United South and Eastern Tribes, Incorporated (USET) is an intertribal organization comprised of

twenty-five (25) federally recognized Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the actions taken by the USET Board of Directors officially represent the intentions of each member

Tribe, as the Board of Directors comprises delegates from the member Tribes' leadership; and

WHEREAS, the Cayuga Nation of New York (Cayuga Nation) is a member in good standing of USET; and

WHEREAS, the Cayuga Nation is a treatied Indian Nation or Tribe in the United States without sovereign land; and

WHEREAS, in April and May of 2005, the Cayuga Nation filed applications with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) to

have approximately 125 acres of land owned by the Cayuga Nation on its historic 64,015 acre reservation taken into trust by the Federal Government for the benefit of the Cayuga Nation (the Cayuga

Nation's fee-to-trust applications); and

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2009, the Cayuga Nation was informed that the Obama Administration, acting through the

Department of Interior, had approved the publication of Notices of Availability (NOA) of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) prepared in connection with the Cayuga Nation's fee-to-trust

applications; and

WHEREAS. the BIA intends to publish an NOA of the DEIS in the Federal Register on May 22, 2009, and has

instructed the Cayuga Nation to publish its NOA in local newspapers on May 22, 2009, and to reserve a

location for the public hearing on the DEIS for June 15, 2009; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the "The Mission of USET" and our "Statement of Unity," USET is committed to assisting

member Tribes and their governments in dealing effectively with issues affecting the sovereignty of

member Tribes; and

WHEREAS, USET recognizes the importance to the Cayuga Nation of its fee-to-trust applications and fully supports

the expeditious processing and acceptance of these applications by the BIA; and, therefore, be it

RESOLVED the USET Board of Directors urges the Obama Administration, acting through the Bureau of Indian

Affairs, to expeditiously process and accept the Cayuga Nation's fee-to-trust applications and to issue a Record of Decision accepting the Cayuga Nation's lands which are the subject of the fee-to-trust applications into trust by the Federal Government for the benefit of the Cayuga Nation at the earliest

possible date.
